Welcome to the Museum Barberini. The museum is responsible for preserving unique works of art for future generations. At the same time we would like to make your visit to the museum as pleasant as possible. We therefore ask that you adhere to several rules. Our supervisory staff is in charge of ensuring that these rules are followed. Please follow the instructions of our staff when politely requested to respect our security measures or when asked to abide by these rules.

All interior and exterior spaces are equipped with surveillance cameras to protect the valuable works of art. We are pleased if you are interested in the details of artworks on exhibit. However, in order to protect valuable paintings, we ask that you keep a distance of one arm's length to the objects on display. The lines on the floor mark the safe distance to the exhibits. If you cross this line, a security alarm will sound.



Backpacks and large bags (larger than DIN A4) present a security risk. Please store them in the lockers on the lower floor. Please do not take umbrellas, canes, bike helmets, or similar objects with you into the exhibition galleries. Walkers may be used in the galleries. Jackets and coats may not be carried over your arm in the exhibition galleries. Wet clothing places a strain on the carefully controlled indoor climate in the galleries and should also be checked or stored. We assume no liability for items left in the storage lockers and the coat room.



You may take photographs for private use only. The use of flash, tripods or selfie sticks is not permitted. Please be aware that publishing photos online or posting them on social media is not considered private use and may, under certain circumstances, infringe on copyright laws. Taking photographs and filming for professional and commercial purposes requires the prior approval of the Museum Barberini.



Please silence your cell phone when you are in the museum and do not take or make calls. This allows other visitors to enjoy their time at the museum. You may use your phone on the lower floor and in the foyer.



Animals, with the exception of assistance dogs, are not allowed in the museum. Dogs must be kept on a leash in the outdoor area.



During operating hours it is possible that certain exhibition galleries are temporarily closed. We appreciate your understanding. We will try to announce such closures as soon as possible.



Small children are welcome to visit the museum with you! Baby carriages and strollers can be taken into the galleries as long as the exhibition is not too crowded. We also have complimentary strollers available.



The entire building is handicap accessible. We also have complimentary wheelchairs available.



One of our goals is to introduce children to art. However, children are generally unfamiliar with the security measures found in museums. We therefore ask that you do not leave children under 12 unsupervised.



Please do not take food and beverages into the exhibition galleries. Eating and drinking is allowed in the service area on the lower floor and in the foyer. You may also visit our restaurant.



Only regular or colored pencils are allowed when drawing and writing in the galleries.



Smoking is prohibited throughout the entire museum building.
